

Fund Objective

The fund will aim to deliver smooth, positive real returns (adjusted for the effects of inflation) targeting CPI +5% over a rolling 3 year period with less volatility than a multi asset high equity or pure equity fund.

Fund Strategy

This actively managed fund will invest in a combination of investments in equity, bonds, money market instruments and listed property. The fund will be mandated to invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments (derivatives) for efficient portfolio management and in order to achieve its investment objective. The fund will comply with regulations governing pension funds.

The Manager shall be permitted to invest on behalf of the fund in offshore investments as legislation permits. Apart from the above, the fund may also invest in participatory interests of portfolios of collective investment schemes registered in the Republic of South Africa or of participatory interests in collective investment schemes or other similar schemes operated in territories with a regulatory environment which is to the satisfaction of the Manager and the Trustee of a sufficient standard to provide for investor protection which is at least equivalent to that in South Africa.

The Trustee shall ensure that the investment policy set out in the preceding clauses are adhered to; provided that nothing contained in this clause shall preclude the Manager from varying the proportions of securities in terms of changing economic factors or market conditions or from retaining cash in the fund and/or placing cash on deposit.

Tax Free Unit Trust

This fund qualifies as a tax free investment according to section 12T of the Income Tax Act, with effect from 1 March 2015. South African individuals qualify for the associated tax benefits namely no tax on dividends, income or capital gains whilst still enjoying all the benefits of a unit trust. Note contributions to tax free investments are limited to R36 000 per tax year, with a lifetime limit of R500 000. Amounts invested in excess of these permissible thresholds are taxable.

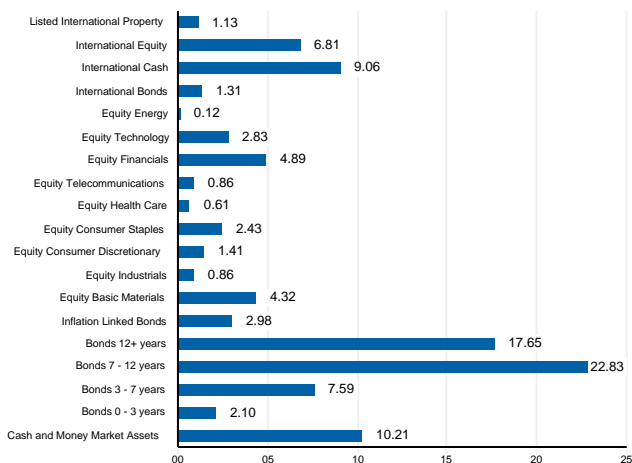
