FUND DESCRIPTION

The fund is actively managed and invests globally across asset classes, but will generally have an equity bias. The fund is focused on bottom-up, fundamental stock selection. We will ensure that asset allocation is driven by the expected returns from each asset class that will achieve a reasonable return with an acceptable amount of risk. The standard deviation of returns of the fund should be similar to those of the benchmark (MSCI World US\$). The fund cannot use leverage or have net short positions.

FUND OBJECTIVE

The fund aims to create long-term wealth for investors. In addition to outperforming the benchmark, the fund also aims to outperform the average return of a similar peer group without assuming additional risk.

FUND STRATEGY

The fund seeks to acquire great global companies trading at material discounts to intrinsic value and where earnings are likely to grow over the medium-to-longer-term because of structural industry tailwinds. We place particular emphasis on analysing the strength of the business model, the sustainability of returns and the ability of a company to pay increasingly higher dividends to shareholders. Importantly, we want to be shareholders in these companies for a long time. We are keenly aware that great companies do not always make great investments if they are purchased at the wrong price. If the returns from equities as an asset class do not look attractive, we will strategically allocate funds to alternative asset classes where the returns are more attractive in order to protect capital and reduce volatility.

LIKELY INVESTORS

Investors who are seeking exposure to global investments to provide long-term capital growth while accepting short-to-medium term market fluctuation. Investors should have an investment horizon of more than three years. Investors should be prepared to accept the risk of capital loss.

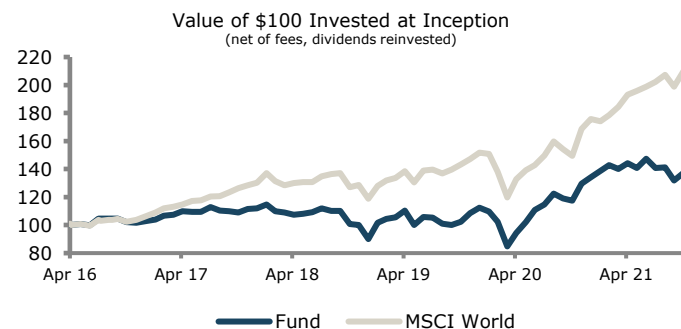

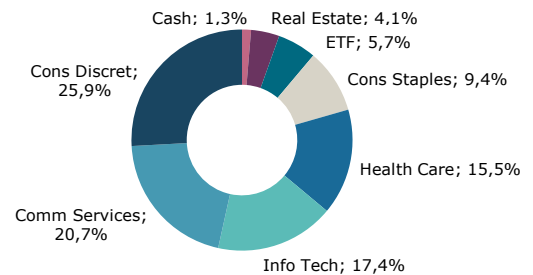

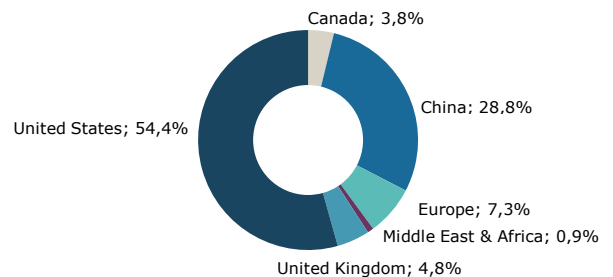

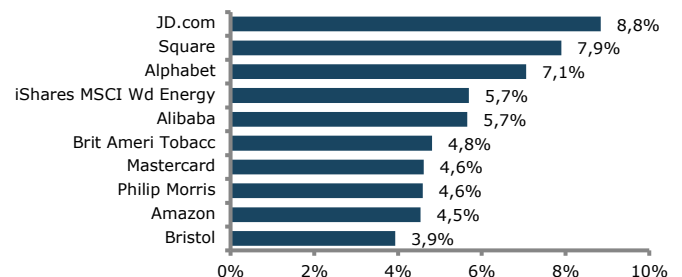
ASSET / SECTOR ALLOCATION

MONTHLY PERFORMANCE COMMENTARY

The fund had a return of +4.2% for October 2021 compared to +5.7% for the benchmark, resulting in underperformance of 1.5%.

For October 2021, the best performing shares in the fund relative to the benchmark were: Alibaba (+14.7%), Alphabet (+11.3%), JD.com (+9.7%), Netflix (+13.1%) and Covetrus (+11.3%).

For October 2021 the worst performing shares in the fund relative to the benchmark were: Mastercard (-3.4%), VNET (-9.4%), EPP (-6.4%), Meta Platforms (-4.7%) and Bristol-Myers Squibb (-1.3%).

FUND COMMENTARY

October is the start of proverbial reporting season as US stocks report quarterly earnings. Some of the businesses you own in the fund reported results and we highlight some of the more pertinent features.

Mastercard, which is about a third smaller than Visa, posted good third quarter results yet the share price fell 4% on the news. The share price action was not so much about what result contained, as revenue and earnings came in higher than expected, but more due to the fact that management did not provide commentary or guidance for the 2022 financial year. The results themselves were good and showed a decent covid recovery in key areas such as cross-border payments, which were up 52% on a local currency volume basis. The CEO stated that cross-border spending has recently returned to pre-pandemic levels. He also said that "The muscle memory that got built during the pandemic with consumers who had been reluctant to get into e-commerce experiences is embedded and the most difficult thing to do is change consumer behaviour and the pandemic helped change consumer behaviour." For the fourth quarter, Mastercard expects "mid-20s" percentage growth in revenue, on a GAAP basis, and "mid-teens" growth in GAAP operating expenses, both relative to the prior-year quarter. The fourth quarter FactSet revenue analyst estimates of \$5.20 billion implies 26.1% growth. We view the weakness in the share price, which is off around 20% from its highs, as an attractive entry point into a business that is likely to be a major player in the global secular switch to electronic payments. Mastercard's business has high barriers to entry and is one of the best quality businesses in our investment universe.

Stryker released a soft set of third quarter numbers that came in marginally below expectations. This was in the face of rising covid disruptions within the business. The covid resurgence in the US led to the deferral of many elective procedures, pressuring procedure volumes. Despite these net sales increased by 11.3% from 2020 YoY and 16% from 2019 YoY. Adjusted EPS increased 2.8%, ignoring the impact of many once of items. Divisional sales for the third quarter showed good growth particularly MedSurge which grew organic sales by 11.9% from the 2019 base and Neurotechnology and Spine which grew sales by 11.8% from the 2019 base. Management indicated that factors such as covid and the labour and staffing environment in healthcare could potentially hinder an accelerated recovery. Management expects 2021 organic net sales growth to be in the range of 7% to 8% from 2019 levels. Stryker is a premium growth story within the MedTech space and will benefit as the world normalises and recovers from covid induced lockdowns.

Amazon showed strong revenue growth of 15.2% for the third quarter which marginally missing analyst expectations. A significant rise in spending led to weaker results on the bottom line where GAAP EPS declined more than expected, falling by 50.5%. These numbers reflect Amazons continued push to fund long term growth rather than focus on short term earnings. Sales in North America grew 10% while international sales improve by 15%. AWS continues to produce incredible growth and profitability, displaying a 39% rise in net sales and a 38% improvement in operating income. Amazon presented several highlights across their operating businesses emphasizing the continual development of innovative products and pro-growth initiatives. The company has guided for net sales to grow between 4% and 12% for the fourth quarter with lower operating income compared to 2020 given increased costs in the consumer business as labour supply shortages, increased wage costs, global supply chain issues, and increased freight and shipping costs are all managed and optimised. In the US ecommerce sales still only represent 20% of total retail sales and we believe this provides Amazon with a structural and long-term total addressable market opportunity.

Alphabet produced a strong set of results ahead of analyst estimates for the third quarter, off an already elevated base. Total revenue increased 41% YoY with Google's advertising business revenue rising by 43%. YouTube also increased advertising revenue by 43% and YouTube subscribers surpassed the 50 million mark. Google Cloud continued its growth trajectory with revenue increasing by 44%, as the business gained more clients and expanded its cloud services and capabilities. Alphabet's operational leverage translated into total income growth of 88% despite a 40% increase in total acquisition costs in the the advertising businesses. The business continued to repurchase shares, buying back an aggregate \$12.6bn worth of shares in the quarter. Alphabet ended the quarter with a net cash position of \$128bn which is the largest cash pile of any business in the world. There are several new product developments that are set to drive future growth. The new Pixel 6 was launched to positive reviews and this smart phone is powered by Google Tensor, which is Google's first in house developed chip. This was released along with a variety of other hardware products. Waymo has continued to expand its autonomous driving programme to more cities. Alphabet is up by more than 60% for the year to date.

GLOSSARY

Advice fee means any advice fee that is negotiable between the client and their financial advisor. An annual advice fee negotiated is paid via a repurchase of units from the investor.

Total Expense Ratio (TER) means a measure of a fund's assets that have been expended as payment for services rendered in the management of the fund, expressed as a percentage of the average daily value of the fund calculated over a period of a financial year by the manager of the fund. This includes fund management fees, trustee fees, custody fees, legal fees, director's fees, regulatory charges, brokerage charges, administrative fees, bank charges and audit fees. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER may not necessarily be an accurate indication of future TER's.

Transaction Cost (TC) are the costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the fund. Transaction Costs are a necessary cost in administering the fund and impacts the fund's returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of fund, the investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

Total Investment Charges (TIC) consist of the sum of the Total Expense Ratio and the Transaction Costs, as a percentage of the NAV of the fund.

Alternative Investment Fund Manager (AIFM)

MSCI World Index - The MSCI World Index captures large and mid-cap representation across 23 Developed Markets countries. With 1,644 constituents, the index covers approximately 85% of the free float-adjusted market capitalization in each country. The index is based on the MSCI Global Investable Indexes (GIMI) Methodology—a comprehensive and consistent approach to index construction that allows for meaningful global views and cross regional comparisons across all market capitalization size, sector and style segments and combinations. This methodology aims to provide exhaustive coverage of the relevant investment opportunity set with a strong emphasis on index liquidity, investability and replicability. The index is reviewed quarterly—in February, May, August and November—with the objective of reflecting change in the underlying equity markets in a timely manner, while limiting undue index turnover. During the May and November semi-annual index reviews, the index is rebalanced and the large and mid-capitalization cutoff points are recalculated.

Standard deviation is a measure of the dispersion of monthly returns from the returns generated by a benchmark. The more spread apart the returns, the higher the deviation.

Collective investment scheme (CIS) - Collective investment schemes (also called unit trusts) are portfolios of assets such as equities, bonds, cash and listed property, in which investors can buy units. They allow private investors to pool their money together into a single fund, thus spreading their risk across a range of investments, getting the benefit of professional fund management, and reducing their costs.

Annualised performance: Annualised performance show longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.
