

Fund Objective

The objective of the fund is to provide an investment vehicle for investors who want to achieve long term capital appreciation. The portfolio aims to outperform the MSCI Emerging Market Total Return Net Index over a rolling three year period.

Fund Strategy

The portfolio will apart from assets in liquid form, invest in participatory interest of the Sanlam Global Emerging Markets Fund established under the Sanlam Universal Fund PLC approved by the Irish Regulator. The Sanlam Global Emerging Markets Feeder Fund will have foreign exposure of at least 85% at all times. Subject to the investment restrictions, the underlying portfolio will primarily invest in equity securities (including equity linked securities such as common stock and preference shares) of companies traded in or dealt on the stock exchanges or regulated markets. The underlying portfolio may, where the Manager considers it in the best interest of the portfolio, invest up to 100% of its net asset in securities traded in or dealt on the stock exchanges or regulated markets considered by the manager to be emerging and frontier markets. The portfolio may also invest in financial instruments for the exclusive purpose of hedging against exchange rate risk.

Tax Free Unit Trust

This fund qualifies as a tax free investment according to section 12T of the Income Tax Act, with effect from 1 March 2015. South African individuals qualify for the associated tax benefits namely no tax on dividends, income or capital gains whilst still enjoying all the benefits of a unit trust. Note contributions to tax free investments are limited to R36 000 per tax year, with a lifetime limit of R500 000. Amounts invested in excess of these permissible thresholds are taxable.

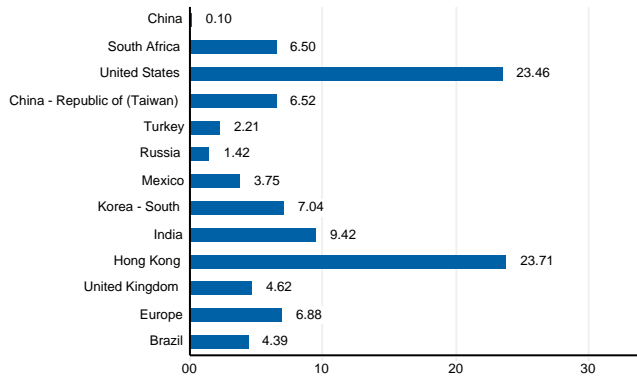
